Secondly, to find out the qualities in him that made him make a mark at the International Arena and to find out how he is as a person. The problem therefore was stated 'A Case Study on International cricketer Irfan Pathan'. A careful and planned study was designed wherein historical, biographical, analytical and interpretive methods were employed to systematically pursue the objective. Data/Information for this study was derived from the primary and secondary sources. To get the first hand information, the investigator visited the school where he studied, the club from where he started learning cricket as a child, his ancestral house where he spent most of his childhood. The investigator personally contacted Irfan Pathan and conducted interview. Almost all his family members were personally interviewed by the Investigator. The researcher also personally contacted his childhood coach, friends, relatives, umpires, trainers, etc. Various pictorial records of Irfan Pathan were investigated. Some of the photographs relevant to different occasions were chosen as documents for the study. Published materials of Irfan Pathan such as books, pamphlets, newspapers etc were studied and information was retained as documents for the study. Data/Information collected through primary and secondary sources were analyzed qualitatively through external and internal criticism. Quantitative analysis was also employed to the data collected by using opinion rating questionnaire for statistical inferences.

Introduction

India had to wait until 1952 to record its first ever Test victory. India beat England by an innings in Madras. It was in the same year that Pakistan gained Test status.

Once again cricket proved its importance as a forum for reviving human bonds. India clashed with the visiting Pakistan team in 1952 initiating a new intense sporting rivalry between the newly formed neighbours. Unlike India, Pakistan managed to record their first ever win within a mere two years in 1954. As India and Pakistan went to war in 1960, cricket matches were suspended. It was just the beginning of a series of suspensions to come⁹.

The Case Study involves an investigator who makes a detailed examination of a single subject or group or phenomenon¹⁰.

A case study is a complete analysis and report on the status of a particular individual subject, school institution, playground, community or city with a view to ensure possible improvement of status of the case under investigation¹¹.

Statement of the problem

The purpose of the present study was firstly to highlight the achievements of Irfan Pathan at National and International Level. Secondly how he has dealt with various highs and lows in his cricketing career and how he has been a person. Keeping in view the above said purpose, the problem has been stated as a case study on international cricketer Irfan Pathan.

Delimitations: The study has following delimitations:

The study was delimited to the investigation only on the life of Cricketer Irfan Pathan. The data was collected only by the means of Interview, Questionnaire and Observation methods.

The study was restricted to the investigation of the case A Person.

The study has covered the period from his birth till date.

Limitations: The study depended on the methods used by the researcher to collect information. The validity of the questionnaire cannot be measured. The study depended on the reliability and validity of the responses to be obtained from various persons from which data was collected.

Significance of the study: The study has been considered important because:

This study unfolds the facts by which Irfan Pathan has been an ideal to his friends and colleagues. This study serves as an inspiration to the young and emerging sportsmen. Through this study it was known how Irfan Pathan has dealt with highs and lows in his cricketing career and always emerged as leader.

Design of the study

A case study was designed to investigate the personality and characteristics of Irfan Pathan as a player, a person, as an inspiration and his achievements in the field of cricket in which historical, analytical and interpretive methods were utilized. Keeping in view the objectives of the study the following tools were used for data collection:

Collection of data

Data/Information for this investigation was derived from the primary and secondary sources.

Primary Sources: The original material/information was collected from the following primary sources.

Official records: To get the first hand information investigator visited institutions such as Baroda Cricket Association Baroda, Baroda Sports Club Baroda and M.E.S High School Baroda from where Irfan Pathan played and studied. The investigator physically verified the records of his performances at these places.

Interview: A structured interview schedule covering the following dimensions which was developed by the investigator herself and with the help of the researcher's guide and some experts in field of Physical Education was used. The dimensions were:

Information regarding family background of Irfan Pathan: i. Information regarding childhood days of Irfan Pathan. ii. Information regarding his sports career in Cricket. iii. Information regarding his future plans.

For the purpose of collecting information on the above mentioned dimensions regarding Irfan Pathan, an interview schedule was prepared by the researchers with help of supervisor and experts.

The tentative interview schedule was discussed with the supervisor and Physical education experts with the request to help the researcher with their expert guidance and suggestions to finalize the interview schedule. On the basis of their expert inputs a final interview schedule was prepared covering all the above stated dimensions.

Proper consent of Irfan Pathan was already been taken before commencement of the present research work. Appointment with Irfan Pathan was sought well before hand in view of his sports

engagements and fitness schedule. The investigator personally contacted Irfan Pathan for the interview and conducted the interview with well prepared questionnaire. The focus of the interview was mainly around family history, environment influence, childhood days, education, early days in cricket, his achievements at a very young age, experiences in the national team as well as in the IPL and his future plans.

Personal records: Personal records of Irfan Pathan including educational certificates, sports certificates, medals, awards, honours conferred, appreciation letters and articles written on him etc. were considered by the investigator for the present study.

Pictorial records: Various pictorial records of Irfan Pathan were investigated such as photographs appeared in the newspapers, photographs available on internet and photographs taken at various ceremonies and occasions.

Published material: Published material on Irfan Pathan such as books, articles, newspapers, sports magazines, internet articles etc. were also studied and information retained as documents for this study.

Secondary sources: Interview: Interviews with father of Irfan Pathan Mr. Mehmood Khan, his mother Shamim Banu, His brother and International Cricketer Mr. Yusuf Pathan and sister Shagufta were also conducted to ascertain more personal information on Irfan Pathan. Mr. Mehandi Shaikh the coach of Irfan Pathan and some of his former colleagues and friends were also interviewed through questionnaire and valuable data regarding contributions and achievements, professional career, philosophy, leadership qualities and personality of Irfan Pathan were collected.

Survey: Survey technique was also used to obtain responses from relatives, friends, colleagues, contemporary players, coaches, trainers, physios umpires etc.

The opinion rating scale was administered on the subjects using different modes. In most of the cases the investigator personally visited the subjects after prior appointment and obtained the information on opinion rating scale.

However, in case of distant places very far-off, the scale was mailed to the respondents via email and post which were returned back by them after candid opinion on each item of the scale.

Opinion rating Questionnaire on Irfan Pathan was constructed by the investigator with the help of the experts. Questionnaire consisted of seventy five statements mainly on Irfan Pathan as a Player, as a Person and as an Inspiration.

To estimate the strength of feeling, four degree scale was used such as SA- Strongly Agree, A- Agree, UD – Undecided, DA-Disagree, SDA- Strongly Disagree.

Analysis and interpretation of data

Apart from his sports endeavors, he often visits schools, sports gatherings, colleges and stadiums to motivate youngsters. He is also part of many charitable institutions. He is multi talented and often seen on television as a part of many entertainment programs.

He along with his brother Yusuf Pathan has started an Academy named Cricket Academy of Pathans in Baroda and are planning to open its branches in rest of the country to motivate and inspire new talent in cricket.

Conclusion

Based on the results obtained from the study, the following significant conclusions may be drawn:

Irfan Pathan is one of the most influential cricketer Baroda and Gujarat have ever produced. He is very committed and hardworking professional. He is a player par excellence. 


Figure-1: Summary of the responses for Irfan Pathan as a person.
